



#### **HEADLINES FROM THE YEAR 2023-24**

#### **MARCH 2023**



On the occasion of World Hearing Day, VAANI DCF, in collaboration with the Health and Family Welfare Department of Karnataka, organized an ear screening camp for BMTC and Arogya Saudha staff. Approximately 170 individuals were screened and educated on the significance of ear health.

#### **APRIL 2023**



two-day intensive training session was conducted, and 63 Shiksha Abhivan Samagrah teachers from six districts in Assam engaged in comprehensive program covering story development and narration, language proficiency, curriculum adaptation, and more. 

Our health outreach programs are dedicated to expanding access to essential health services in rural and underserved areas. By collaborating with government hospitals, we conduct newborn hearing screenings to ensure early detection and intervention for hearing impairments. Additionally, we organize community ear checkups to reach untapped locations, providing critical healthcare services to those who need them most.

VAANI's education program adopts a life cycle approach for children with hearing impairments (CWHI), from foundational literacy to secondary and higher education. We emphasize developing language and communication skills and provide training for parents to understand and support their deaf children's communication needs. Additionally, we focus on helping deaf children succeed in their school curriculum, particularly in subjects like science, maths, and language, ensuring they can cope and excel academically.

VAANI's skill-building program empowers deaf children by providing them with vocational training, preparing them for higher education and job opportunities. This program aims to make them confident, independent, and productive members of society, equipping them with the skills needed to excel in their future careers.

VAANI's newborn hearing screening program focuses on early detection and intervention for hearing loss in newborns, ensuring timely support and assistance for children with hearing impairment

## Early Intervention and Follow-Up

VAANI partners with government hospitals and newborns undergo a hearing screening shortly after birth, usually before they leave the hospital.

The screening involves a simple and non-invasive test, such as otoacoustic emissions (OAE) or auditory brainstem response (ABR), to assess the baby's hearing sensitivity.

Once hearing loss is confirmed, the newborn and their family are referred to appropriate early intervention services and support programs of VAANI and others.

Early intervention may include access to hearing aids, cochlear implants, auditory-verbal therapy, sign language instruction, and other services tailored to the child's needs.

VAANI's Educational Intervention Program focuses on providing individualized and holistic support to children with hearing impairment and their families.

## Foundational & Preparatory Stage

focus is on fostering foundational literacy, emphasizing Language and Arithmetic Skills, Motor development, Communication, and Life Skills development

## Middle Stage

The focus is on supporting students with school curriculum, emphasising life skills and digital literacy.

## **Secondary Stage**

Focus is on preparing students to excel in higher standard subjects, particularly in Science and Mathematics, with the goal of ensuring their success in passing the 10th standard.

These E-learning classrooms are designed to provide deaf students with access to high-quality educational resources and interactive learning experiences. The initiative includes:

- Tailored Learning Materials: Customized content and materials that cater to the unique learning needs of deaf students, ensuring they receive a comprehensive education.
- Interactive Sessions: Engaging and interactive online sessions that facilitate better understanding and retention of course material.
- Accessible Technology: Utilizing cutting-edge technology and tools to make learning accessible, including captioned videos, sign language interpretation, and interactive quizzes.
- Supportive Learning Environment: Creating a virtual classroom environment that encourages collaboration, participation, and a sense of community among students.
- Continuous Mentorship: Providing ongoing mentorship and support to help students navigate their academic journey and prepare for future career opportunities.

By integrating E-learning classrooms into our program, we aim to bridge the educational gap for deaf students, empowering them to achieve their academic and career aspirations. This initiative marks a significant step towards creating an inclusive and supportive educational environment for all.





In partnership with Oceanik Educational Institution, we have launched this innovative initiative to support more than 60 deaf students in Pre-University Courses (PUC) and pursuing graduation.



In the year 2023-24, VAANI has made a significant impact through our dedicated efforts in early childhood education. We have provided vital support to children with hearing impairments, ensuring they receive timely intervention and access to educational resources.

Additionally, our youth transition and skill-building programs have empowered young individuals with the necessary tools and skills to navigate their journey into adulthood successfully. By focusing on areas such as technology literacy, vocational training, and personal safety education, we have enabled youth to become self-reliant, confident, and prepared for a bright future.

Our commitment to inclusion and empowerment has made a tangible difference in the lives of those we serve, fostering a more equitable and accessible society for all.

We reached 806 deaf children and 1612 parents, delivering 29,678 Individualized Educational Assistance sessions through dedicated educators and interventionists.

In total of 15489 neonates have been screened and 35 have been referred for BERA confirmation, out of which 5 were identified as having hearing loss.

172 children enrolled in computer training, received 5672 sessions. Additionally, 61 children received 2911 tailoring sessions, while 40 participated in 50 Karate training sessions, with 20 advancing to the next level and earning yellow belts.



Pari Saikia, a seventeen-and-a-half-year-old girl from Haluwagaon, Nagaon in Assam, has shown that determination and the right support can overcome any obstacle. Despite facing significant challenges due to her bilateral severe hearing loss, Pari remained focused on her academic success.

Attending Haluwagaon High School, Pari aimed to pass her 10th Board exams. Since 2015, she and her mother have been actively involved with VAANI's Outreach Centre in Puranigudam, Nagaon. The regular Educational Sessions and Parents Workshops at VAANI played a crucial role in her academic journey. The VAANI team's dedicated efforts, combined with her mother's proactive involvement, ensured Pari's holistic development and boosted her confidence.

Pari's mother proudly shares, "I am so happy today because my daughter has passed her 10th Board exams. I am immensely grateful to Dudumoni and Taherul Sir, and the entire VAANI team for their unwavering support."

Pari's success in her 10th Board exams is a testament to her resilience and the support from her family and VAANI. She aspires to become a teacher, and VAANI remains committed to helping her achieve this dream.

Pari Saikia's story is an inspiring example of how determination and community support can lead to remarkable achievements. VAANI Deaf Children's Foundation continues to empower children like Pari, helping them overcome challenges and reach their full potential.





Anisha Borah, an eighteen-year-old from Naltoli, Kaliabor, Nagaon, has shown remarkable resilience in overcoming her bilateral severe hearing loss. Living with her parents, Sumi and Haren, and her younger sister, Anisha's journey has been one of determination and support.

Diagnosed at the age of three, Anisha was enrolled in a general school due to the lack of early intervention centres. In 2015, her mother discovered VAANI's Outreach Centre in Puranigudam, Nagaon. Since then, they have regularly attended sessions and workshops, receiving vital support and guidance.

Anisha recently passed her 10th Board Exams from Paschim Pubthoria High School in Kaliabor. Her mother expresses gratitude, saying, "The VAANI team from Guwahati supported us tremendously. Dudumoni and Teherul Sir dedicated significant time and effort, to providing notes and simplifying complex concepts for Anisha. This empowerment has been immensely helpful."

Beyond academics, Anisha has a keen interest in modelling and art, having participated in several fashion shows. She plans to complete her 12th grade and pursue a career in computers.

## COMMUNITY AWARENESS

## **TEACHER TRAININGS**



Our teacher training program aims to equip teachers in mainstream schools with the skills to create an inclusive environment for children with hearing impairments.

Additionally, we focus on training our special educators, who work with these children, in the latest techniques.

The training emphasizes using directed activities, storytelling, textbook adaptation, and sign language as tools to develop language skills and enhance comprehension and knowledge for these students.
















### An Evening to Remember - October 6th, 2023




#### **One-Year Milestone of Our Youth Transition Centre**
