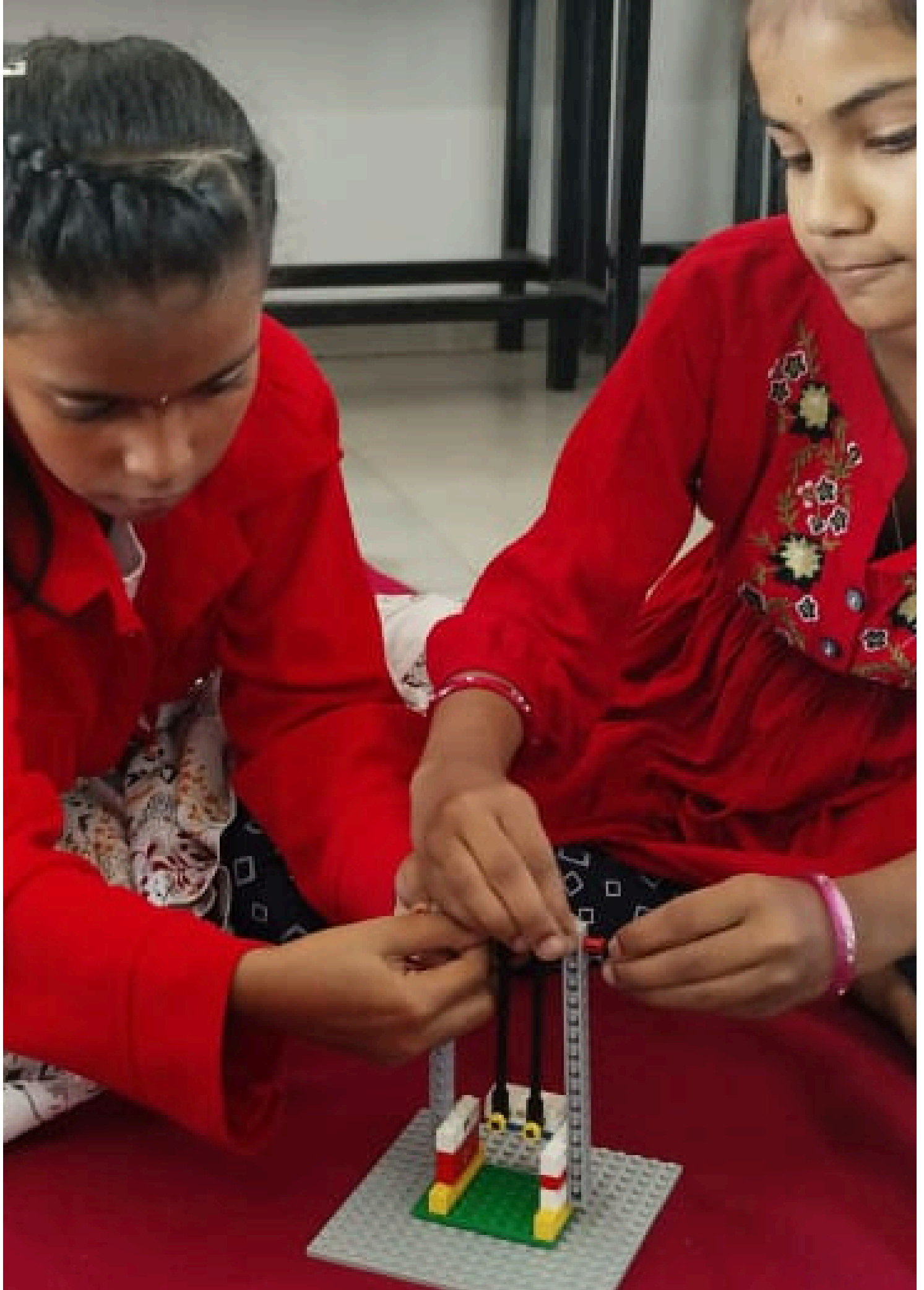

Since its inception in August 2005, VAANI's Educational Intervention Program has been dedicated to bridging the communication and learning gap for deaf children across India. Guided by the belief that every child has the right to language, learning, and inclusion, the program has grown into a life-cycle approach, supporting children from early childhood through adolescence and ensuring they are not left behind in their right to education and participation.

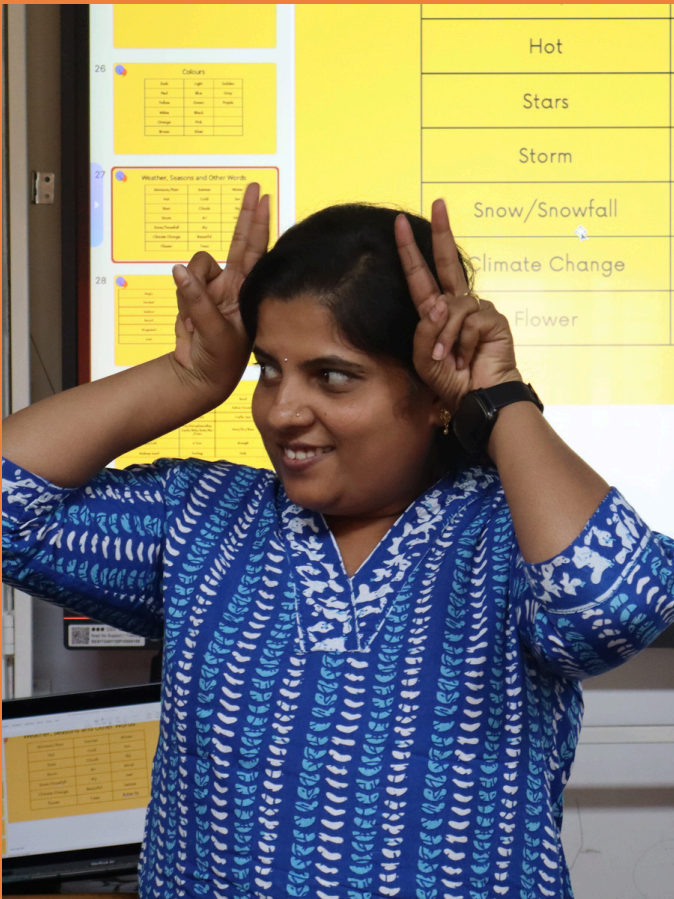
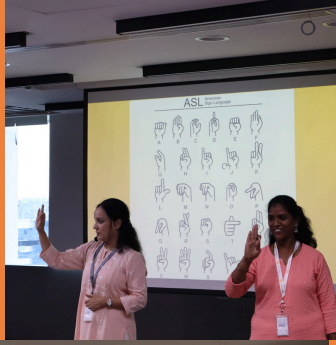


Volunteer Engagement

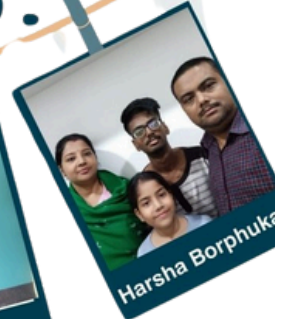
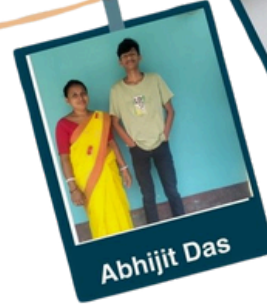


“A Journey from Silence to Strength”

Opinion

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Financial Statements

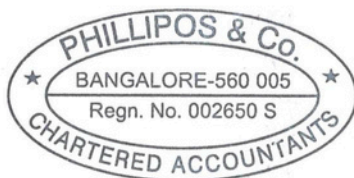
