

Early Detection for Lifelong Impact

Since its inception in July 2019, VAANI's Newborn Hearing Screening (NBHS) initiative has worked to identify hearing loss early—when intervention is most effective. Our program ensures that no child is left behind due to undetected hearing impairment.





listen—he engaged.





Independent Auditor's Report

Opinion
