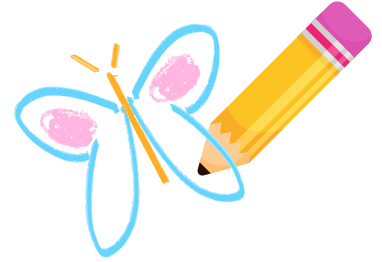

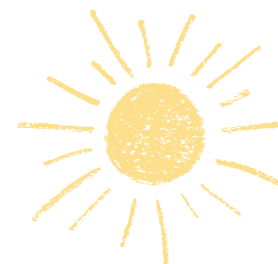

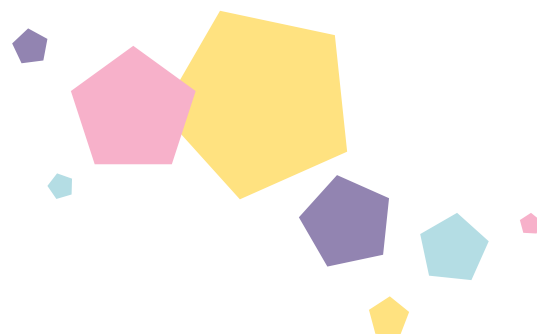

VAANI Deaf Children's Foundation is a 20-year-old organisation dedicated to supporting deaf and hard-of-hearing children and their families, particularly in underserved and remote regions across India. We follow a life-cycle approach, from early identification of hearing loss at birth to educational support, higher education, skill development, and pathways to employment, ensuring continuity of care and learning. VAANI currently works with children and youth aged 0–25 years across Assam, Meghalaya, West Bengal, Karnataka, and Maharashtra, empowering families through inclusive, community-based interventions. Its vision is to ensure that no deaf child is left behind at birth, in school, or in life, while its mission is to bring language and communication into the lives of deaf children and their families, enabling meaningful interaction with the world with respect and dignity.

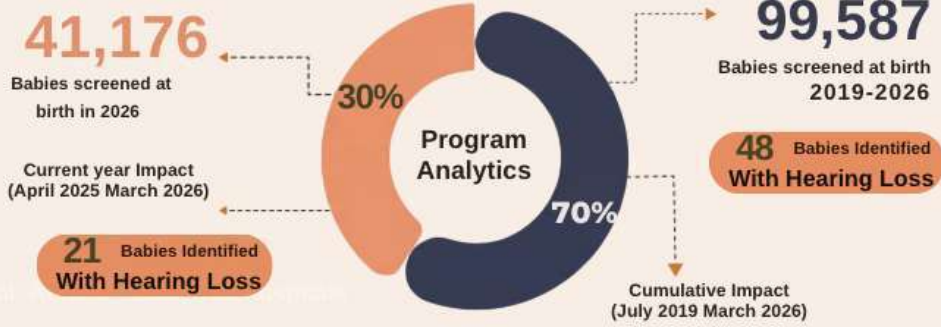

Newborn Hearing Screening

"Every child deserves to be heard—no deaf child left behind."

VAANI DCF 2025-26



1. All newborns are screened for hearing loss within 48 hours of birth, before hospital discharge, and parents/caregivers are provided with counselling.
2. Infants with risk indicators are referred for BERA for further audiological assessment.
3. Families receive timely counselling, and identified children are enrolled in parent-infant and early intervention programs.

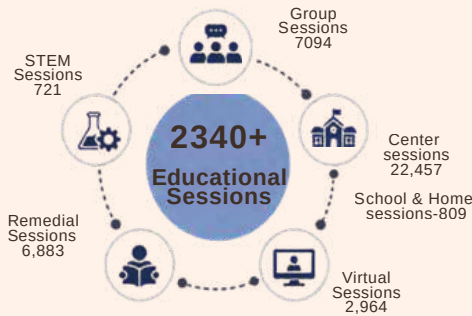

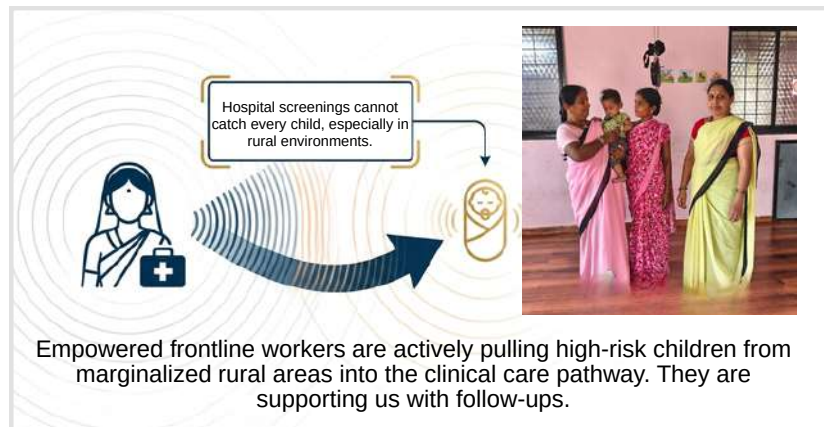

VAANI trained over 1,655 professionals, including ASHA and Anganwadi workers, to identify early signs of hearing loss and facilitate timely referrals for intervention. Through the use of locally adapted IEC materials across all NBHS hospitals, every screening interaction becomes an opportunity to raise awareness, helping more children access early diagnosis and support during their critical developmental years.





In Meghalaya

Across two locations, **Kyrdemkulai** and **Shillong**, 79 deaf and hard-of-hearing children from the School and Centre for Hearing Handicapped Children and Ferrando Inclusive Secondary School took part in a four-day, hands-on STEM program designed around their learning and communication needs. The curriculum combined visual aids, sign language support, and stepwise demonstrations to make concepts like motion tangible and accessible.

Teachers received dedicated training ahead of the program and guided students through building functional models using STEM kits and assistive tools, using clear visual cues and reinforcement to ensure every child could participate meaningfully.

Digital Learning in Indian Sign Language

Through a groundbreaking partnership with the Inclusive Mentoring Academy, we have launched a series of accessible, interactive ISL tutorial videos covering science, Canva, and ChatGPT. This initiative empowers deaf and hard-of-hearing children to develop digital skills with ease.

The digital content is designed to be engaging, culturally relevant, and readily accessible on our Little VAANI YouTube channel—breaking down barriers to education and fostering greater inclusion.



Empowering Teachers with ChatGPT & Canva

VAANI partnered with WinVinaya InfoSystems to conduct a Training of Trainers (ToT) workshop on digital skills for educators. Participants explored tools like ChatGPT and Canva, and created posters, presentations, flashcards, storybooks, and planners — all designed to support visual and inclusive learning for deaf and hard-of-hearing children. This initiative aims to seamlessly integrate digital content into everyday classroom learning, ensuring every child benefits from an engaging and empowering educational & digital experience.





National Conference: Limitless Horizons

The **National Conference – Limitless Horizons** was held on 21 February 2026 at Novotel, Guwahati, bringing together parents, educators, health professionals, government representatives, and partners to reflect on building stronger pathways for deaf children and their families.

Supported by Thomson Reuters, the conference saw the participation of key government officials and experts, including representatives from the Departments of Education and Health, alongside specialists in inclusive education, early intervention, and youth development. Their insights, along with powerful voices of parents and deaf youth, brought depth and real-life perspective to the discussions.

Key sessions focused on early identification, inclusive education, parent empowerment, and pathways to higher education and livelihoods. A special highlight was the sharing of lived experiences by parents, reinforcing their role as changemakers and advocates. The event also featured a cultural performance by deaf children, celebrating expression, confidence, and inclusion.

The conference reinforced a simple but powerful message—when families, systems, and communities come together, inclusion becomes a shared and achievable reality.



Early Identification & Role of Parents

Mr Nitin Sisodia presented SOHUM Innovation Lab's low-cost newborn hearing screening technology, emphasising early detection, referral systems, and parent involvement in rural settings.

Inclusive Education & Responsive Parenting

Dr Varsha Gathoo introduced the "3Rs" framework and advocated for responsive parenting, UDL, and child-centred learning aligned with NEP 2020.

Parents as Advocates

Ms Brinda Crishna and Ms Inky Sen highlighted how parental support and community awareness can transform deaf children's educational and career journeys and provide them with social and emotional support. Most importantly, they demonstrated how parents can become powerful advocates for their children and for the wider Deaf community.

Higher Education & Deaf Youth Empowerment

Mr Aman Sharma explored higher education and employment pathways for deaf youth, challenging stereotypes in professional sectors.

Corporate Responsibility & Social Impact

Ms Ashika G emphasised the need for meaningful corporate engagement, stronger investments in the Northeast, and partnerships that move beyond compliance to sustainable inclusion.

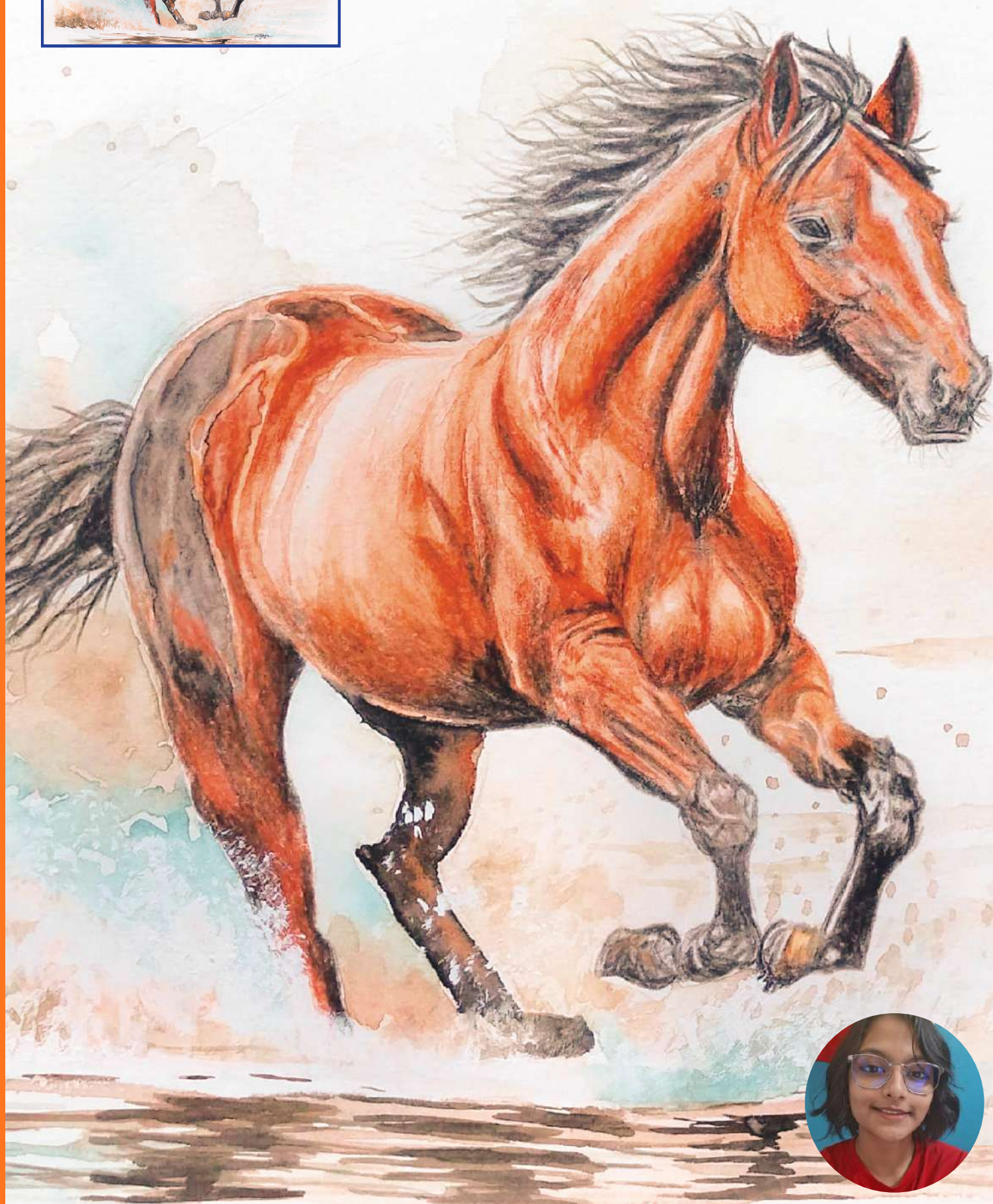

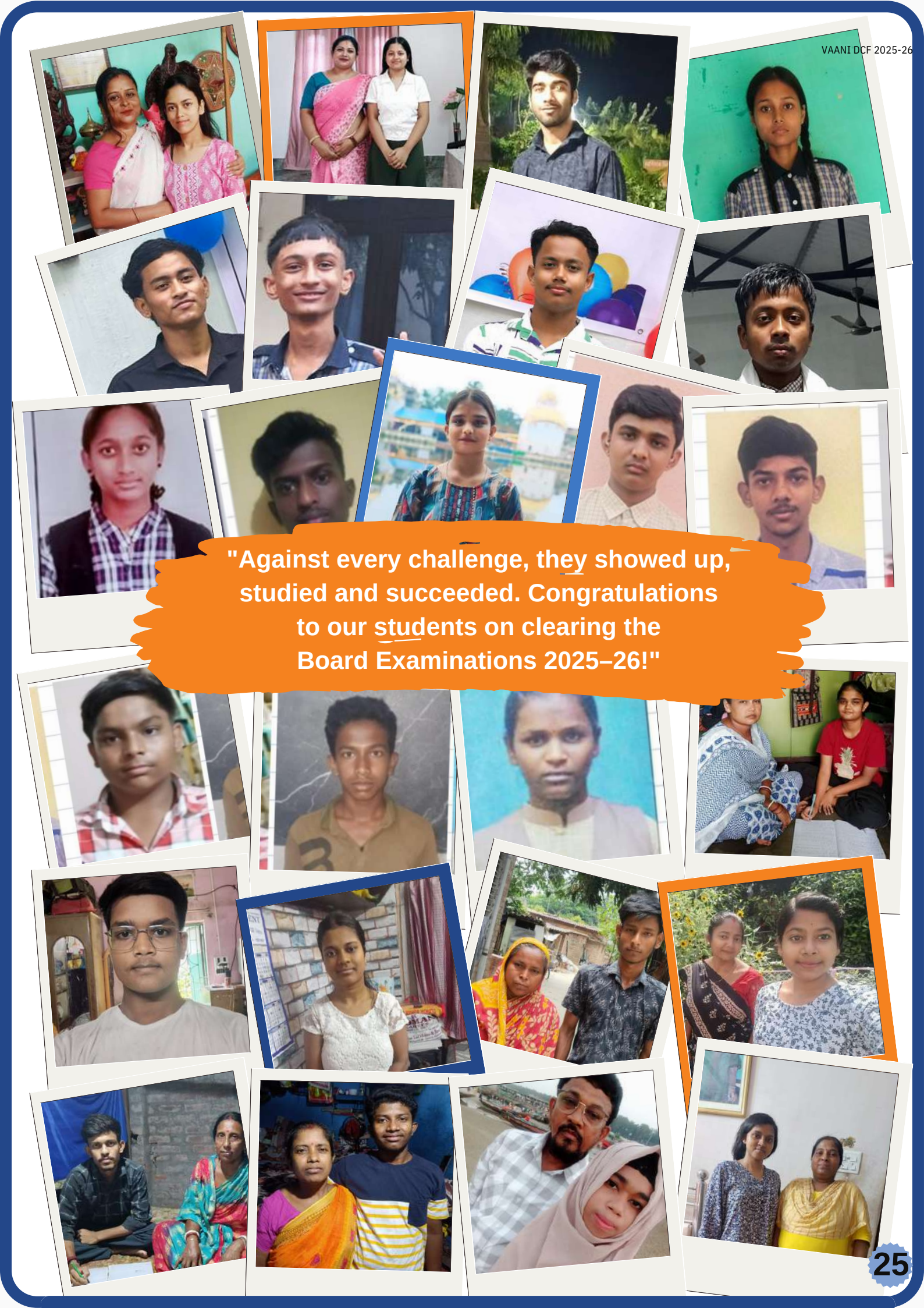

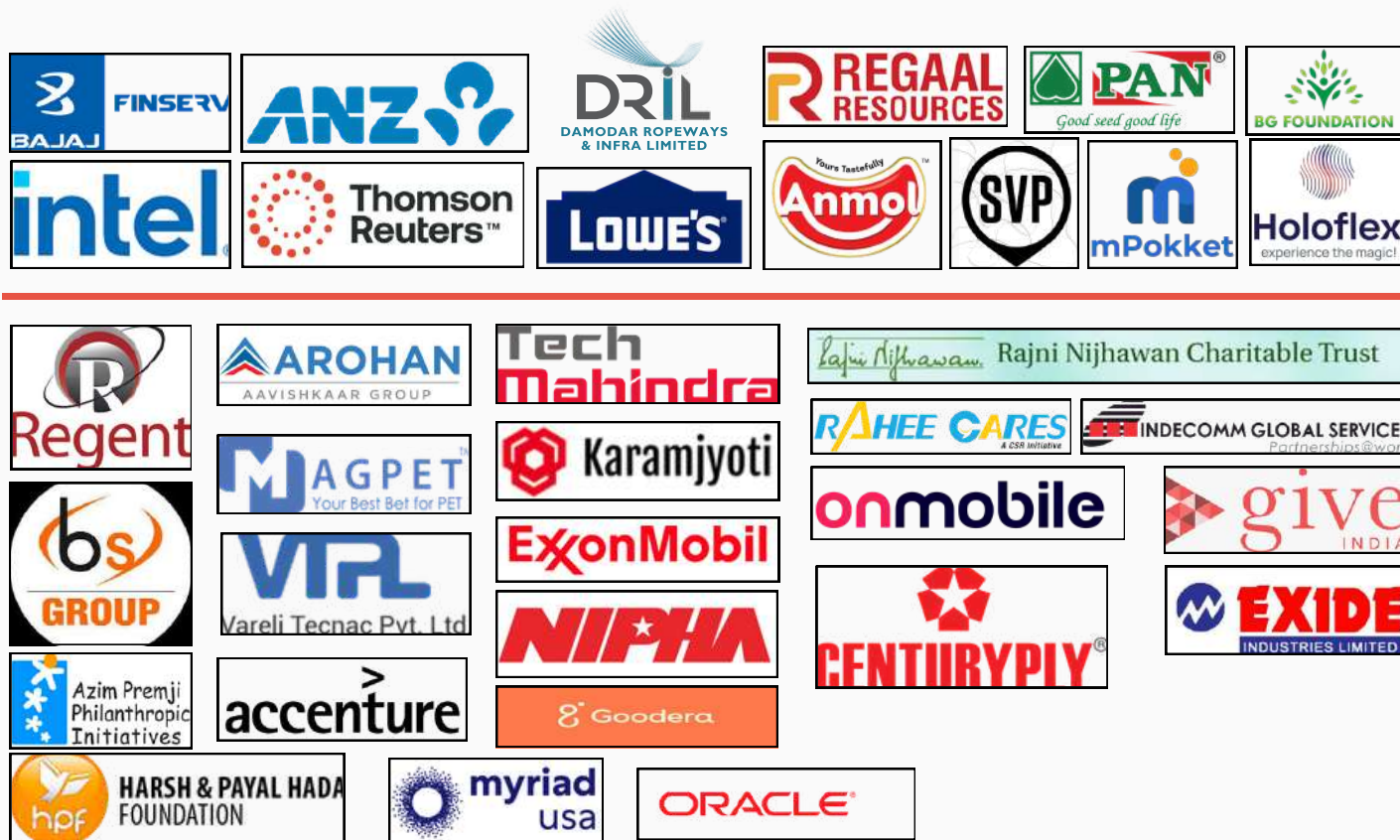

Opinion

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of Financial Statements

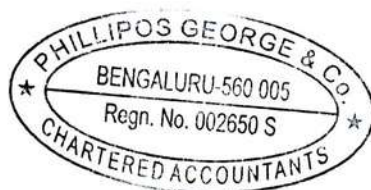
